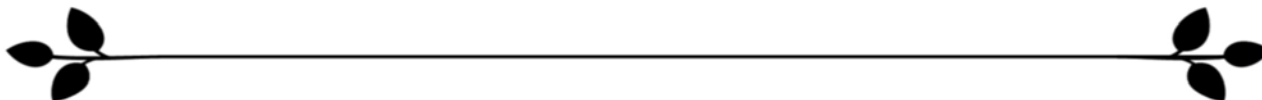

The Community to Home (C2H) Program is a grant-funded initiative through the Pennsylvania Department of Health that provides free home visiting services to families of children and youth (birth through age 21) with special health care needs who reside in eligible rural Pennsylvania counties. The program is designed to improve health outcomes for children and youth with special health care needs (CYSHCN) by reducing barriers to care and connecting families with essential resources and supports.

Eligible participants include children and youth who are newly diagnosed with, at risk for, or have an existing developmental, physical, emotional, or behavioral health condition and have not previously received needed services. The program also serves families who have recently relocated to an eligible rural Pennsylvania county and need assistance establishing services. Families must meet the program's income eligibility requirements of 300% or less of the Federal Poverty Level.

Services are provided by Certified Community Health Workers (CCHWs) through in-home visits and telehealth for up to six months. Support is individualized to each family's needs and may include:

- Developing a personalized care plan to promote long-term self-sufficiency.
- Connecting families with community resources and support services.
- Assisting with applications for benefits and programs.
- Providing education about a child's health, development, and available services.
- Attending and advocating during medical appointments, Individualized Education Program (IEP) meetings, and other service-related appointments.
